Outbreak Investigated Demonstration Survey Trip

R-FETPV staff made the survey trip at The Regional Livestock Office No.5 and Chai Prakan Dairy Agriculture Cooperative Limited, Chiangmai for preparing the Outbreak Investigation Demonstration Workshop during 7th – 8th November 2022.



The Second Visit under the R-FETPV 1st & 2nd Module 2022

Participants from the 1st Module cohort of 2022 were invited back to FETPV Coordinating Unit to join the 2nd visit under the R-FETPV 1st & 2nd Module 2022 during 13th November – 4th December 2022.Trainees presented their outputs outputs and attended the outbreak investigation demonstration workshop.



Scientific Conference on R-FETPV Output Presentation of 1st R-FETPV (13th batch of 2022) and 2nd R-FETPV (12th batch of 2021)

R-FETPV organized The Scientific Conference on R-FETPV Output Presentation on 16 – 17 November 2022 at Cinnamon Residence Hotel. Six outputs of animal disease outbreak investigation were presented by six Thai trainees from cohort of 2018, 2019, and 2021 on day 1: 16 November 2022.

On day 2 of 17 November, Six out of eight from the 13th batch trainee including 2 internationals from Nepal and Philippines and 4 Thai gave oral presentations on their outputs of animal health situation/surveillance data analysis. Additional comments and technical inputs were provided by invited experts Certificates of achievement for trainees who have successfully completed the R-FETPV 2nd Module, 2021 and First Module 2022 were presented.

The Value Chain Analysis Workshop

The Value Chain Analysis Workshop was organized on $21^{st} - 22^{nd}$ November 2022 at Tieng Tansanguan conference room (3^{rd} floor), The Veterinary Council of Thailand before attending the Outbreak Investigation Demonstration Workshop. Assistant Professor Dr. Waraphon Phimpraphai, lecturer from Department of Veterinary Public Health at Kasetsart University and Dr.Tosapol Dejyong, from the Department of Livestock Development gave the lecture and led the group activities for trainees.



"Animal Disease Outbreak Investigation"

The Outbreak Investigation Demonstration Workshop on "Bovine Respiratory Disease Complex outbreak in dairy cattle at Chiang Mai" was conducted from 23rd November to 3rd December 2022. Four R-FETPV international trainees from Indonesia (2), Nepal (1) and Philippines (1), four Thai trainees and staff of Herd Health Unit from Regional Livestock No.5 joined the workshop.







Experts from various partners were invited to give the lectures and to share their experiences to workshop participants such as USAID, and Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Chiangmai University. Result of the outbreak investigation was presented by trainee to the Chai Prakan Dairy Cooperative Committee, and the officer from The Regional Livestock Office No.5.
